

Pillow Box

Supplies Needed

1. Printed pillow box layout
2. Scissors
3. Creasing bone/Stylus
4. Glue/Double sided tape



To print: Open file in Adobe Acrobat Reader. If you do not have Acrobat Reader or would like the latest version go to www.Adobe.com for the free download. Click on the print icon. When the print box opens make sure that scaling is set to NONE. Then click on print. Voila you will have a box in no time!

Pillow Box



With your scissors, cut out the pillow box. It should look like the picture to the left. Then grab your creasing bone and draw over the fold lines which will leave behind indented lines.

Creasing bones are available at most craft stores for a few dollars as well as the mats. I personally love this tool I have pictured since I feel like I get cleaner lines. You can also use a stylus or knitting needles as a good alternative. For the mat you can purchase a crease mat or you can use a notebook underneath or a foam mat. I purchased a craft foam mat at the craft store in the kids department for .50 and it works great! Plus you can pick what color you want!

Pillow Box

Fold the tab towards the white inside. Place double sided tape or glue onto the tab.



Fold the box in half and press onto the tab to seal. With a gluestick you may have to use a paper clip or clothes pin to help hold in place while it dries.

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Once the box has dried. Fold in the ends on top of one another. They will stay in place on their own.



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And you are finished! You can fill the box with goodies of all kinds. Plus you can add a nice fat ribbon around the box or other decorations to make it your very own.
